PROGRAM TITLE: Lifeguarding – How Do We Want the Public to Perceive Us?

DESCRIPTION: <u>As Lifeguards how are our actions perceived by the public?</u> How do we train our staff to <u>recognize and understand how the public perceives what we do and how we do it?</u> It is difficult to <u>understand</u> <u>how a misconception of our actions can cause our patrons concern or how our inappropriate actions can lose</u> patrons at our facilities.

NEEDS IDENTIFICATION (What is the issue?): <u>Facilities have a difficult enough time finding, training and keeping qualified staff let alone making the staff realize that their actions affect "business". This session will address how to make the staff realize how their actions affect patrons as well as how to educate patrons regarding why lifeguards do what they do.</u>
